The Silk Stocking Historical District is the location of a significant amount of surviving Victorian architecture. Created in 1975, it was originally bounded by Avenue L, 24th Street, Avenue N, and Rosenberg Avenue (25th Street). The District's by-laws were drawn up and approved in 1977. It is governed by a Board of Directors.

In August 1991, the Board contracted the services of Texana Development and Design, operated by Lennie Brown, to research and prepare nomination forms for submission to the National Register of Historic Places. These papers consist of her files accumulated in preparing the nominations.
