Small grouping of letters to and from Eduord and Catherine Salzmann who were visiting relatives in Europe in August/September 1900. Catherine Salzmann was the widow of Numa Salzmann who founded N. Salzmann Jewelers. There is one letter to her from her daughter, Mrs. Blanche Almeras (1877-1970) who has two small sons, Pierre Numa (1898-1991) and Marcel M. (1900-1973). Blanche is married to Felix G. Almeras, whose mother, Mary Almeras, was lost in the 1900 Storm. The other letters in the collection are rough drafts written by Catherine before mailing a final copy.

Eduord Salzmann (1883-1960) was the son of Catherine and Numa Salzmann. A former Justice of the Peace from Precinct 6 and a retired deputy sheriff, he was also a charter member of the Galveston Rotary Club. In 1900 he was traveling in Europe with his mother, Catherine. His correspondence is from a girl friend, Gertie, who has recently graduated from school, and Sam, who appears to be a manager working for N. Salzmann Jewelers.
